



Largest Openings/Completion Gaps

Award Gaps show the difference between the number of awards (which are post-secondary certificates or degrees) conferred in the specified region and the occupation demand in that same region.

Negative values represent a shortage of degrees earned compared to the demand for the occupations.

Positive values represent a surplus of awards compared to the demand for the occupations.

The terms used in the table are defined as follows:

Award Gap - The difference between the number of awards earned and the Target Range.

Awards - The modeled number graduates projected to move into an occupation. Note that this will always be less than or equal to the count of all completions related to an occupation via the program-occupation crosswalk, as graduates from a program may be distributed among several different occupations. Since the information in this table is geared toward specific regions, online schools are excluded from the data set.

Target Range - The range between Annual Demand and the US Awards Benchmark.

Annual Demand - The total 1-year demand for that occupation in the region.

US Awards Benchmark - The average awards output for a region or regions with similar employment levels as the region being queried.

Award Gaps supply is calculated from the specific degrees offered at local schools and the program-occupation crosswalk that translates the award completions data into estimates of new workers in related occupations. Award Gaps demand is the growth and separation demand of occupations in the region due to the mix of industries and the overall regional growth rate.

Award Gaps is designed to measure the "as-is" relationship of supply and demand. If a shortfall exists in an occupation, this implies employers in the region need to hire graduates in that occupation that attended schools outside your region. If a surplus exists in an occupation, this implies there are not enough jobs in the region to employ all these graduates and therefore at least some of these graduates will need to find jobs in their occupations in other regions.

Appendix B: FAQ and Data Sources

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the detailed 6-digit level, which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is the source of the industry data?

Employment and wages data by industry are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Employment and wage data that are partially or fully nondisclosed are estimated using imputed data. Annual average wages are calculated quarterly using data from the current and preceding three quarters. Data are updated through the latest QCEW release with preliminary estimates by Chmura updated one quarter in advance. Industry forecasts use national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, forecasts for 2021-2031, adapted for regional growth patterns by Chmura.

What is the source of the occupation data?

Employment by occupation data are estimates derived from the Chmura Industry/Occupation Matrix and industry employment data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics—imputed by Chmura where necessary—and updated through the latest QCEW release with preliminary estimates by Chmura updated one quarter in advance. Wages by occupation utilize Bureau of Labor Statistics Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) data, imputed and brought forward by Chmura. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, forecasts for 2021-2031, adapted for regional growth patterns by Chmura. Job ads data are online job posts from the Real-Time Intelligence (RTI) data set, produced wholly by Chmura and gleaned from over 45,000 websites. Data are updated daily and are subject to revision.

What is the source of the postsecondary awards data?

Awards data are based upon degrees conferred for the academic year 2020-2021 and are provided by the National Center for Education Statistics. Occupation employment data are derived from the most recent four quarters of industry employment (from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, updated quarterly) and the industry/occupation matrix available for the region. Occupation training concentrations and shortfalls are calculated by Chmura. The percent college educated are provided by the BLS per the Employment Projections Program.
